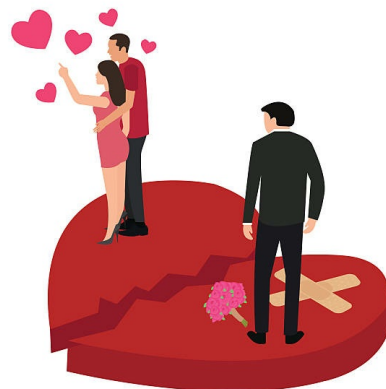


Can dating during a divorce affect your case?
